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Oxygen: almost all (98.5%) is carried by the red blood cells in hemoglobin (where it is bound to iron). A very small amount is dissolved in the blood plasma (1.5%). Carbon dioxide: can be bound to hemoglobin and carried by the red blood cells (23% is carried this way). Very little (7%) is in plasma as dissolved gas.
